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## Towards the New Year

Friends and colleagues, it's been a year to remember. While we're still only midway through the school year, the closing of the calendar year is always an important time to both look backwards and forwards. Many of us have been counting down the days for a long time now, and that speaks to the generally untenable working conditions that many of us have been managing. We know this is due to the de-designation of so many of our students, struggles for timely identification of student needs, full and appropriate staffing of schools, the increasing non-teaching demands placed on teachers, and the trauma of supporting our families and students through a years-long pandemic.

We remind you, as always, that your health and wellbeing needs to come first. While we certainly hope that the two weeks ahead will bring opportunities for restorative choices, we know that the challenges are systemic and severe. Our support of the work at the bargaining tables will be necessary as those members fight on our behalf for stronger protections and better working conditions. Similarly, it's important that our school Staff Rep Teams are recognized for the essential, front-line work they are doing, upholding the collective agreement and supporting members in accessing and defending their rights.

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Please remember that our collective rights, exercised through our union, are also human rights, workers' rights, and that it is by standing together and raising our voices in the face of injustice, that we can make the greatest change for ourselves and our students. It's tempting, especially in a pandemic, to contemplate individualism, competition and meritocracy, damaging ideologies that make it hard to organize. It's by reaching out to one another, sharing information, strategies, learnings and questions that we can fight back against those forces whose impacts include racism, colonialism, sexism, homophobia and transphobia, ableism, ageism and other oppressions. We're reminded of this when we consider our decolonizing work and the concept of "truth first, then reconciliation, then justice".

We'd like to close today with a quote from the great educator and author, bell hooks, who passed away this week, and whose loss is being felt keenly around the world:

*"The classroom, with all its limitations, remains a location of possibility. In that field of possibility, we have the opportunity to labour for freedom, to demand of ourselves and our comrades, and openness of mind and heart that allows us to face reality even as we collectively imagine ways to move beyond boundaries, to transgress. This is education as the practice of freedom."*

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## Staff Rep Union Leave

Anyone accessing union leave is REQUIRED to submit the monthly form to Hitomi at [hitomi@vesta.ca](mailto:hitomi@vesta.ca). Without that verification, we cannot square the number and days of union leave, creating a significant workload issue for VESTA Table Officers and Staff. Please remember that the ½ day per month is available for you to use, but that completion and submitting the form are part of the deal. This is true for Staff Reps, Health and Safety Chairs.
