

We at the Anti-Racism Coalition of Vancouver believe a small action can make a difference. In British Columbia, thousands of students wear pink shirts in support of anti-bullying. Orange Shirt Day has also been introduced across Canadian schools, where students wear orange shirts in solidarity with Indigenous victims of the residential school system.

ARC Vancouver is petitioning for Black Shirt Day to be introduced in BC, in recognition of the struggle for civil rights fought by Black and racialized Canadians. We propose that Black Shirt Day be established on January 15th, the birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr., the great civil rights leader and Nobel Peace Prize winner. We believe this will be an important step in raising greater awareness of the ongoing struggle for civil and human rights faced by Black and racialized Canadians, and help to foster solidarity against all forms of racism and hate.

Payroll Information

An extensive email was sent to all employees on Monday from Payroll. It was pretty dense, so we wanted to offer a bit more of an in-depth commentary on it. Matters that may impact your take home pay:

- Canada Pension Plan (CPP) and Employment Insurance (EI) deductions are determined as a percentage of your income, but there is also an annual maximum. This means that most members will have reached your maximum contributions prior to December 30. How this looks is that you will have fewer deductions nearer the end of the year, and you may notice that your pay is slightly less in the new year, due to those deductions being activated again.
- There is a small increase in the CPP contribution rates, which may also reduce your take home by a small amount.
- Members have the opportunity to elect to have more or less taxes taken off of your paycheque than required by your income. This would just mean more or less of a refund or taxes owing in the spring

Filing your taxes for the year 2020

- Your T4 will look different, as Canada Revenue Agency has required a change to the T4 form in order to simplify the process of reporting income for those who claimed CERB, or any of the Federal emergency or COVID benefits.
- School Supply Tax Credit Form Teachers can claim tax credit when you spend personal income on school supplies. It is up to 15% of \$1,000 spent, and requires your administrator's signature. You can find additional information on what can be claimed at CRA
- CRA work from home tax benefit Teachers working from home for more than 50% over at least 4 weeks can claim a deduction of \$2 per day up to a maximum of \$400 to be deducted for your total income when you file your taxes. You do not need anything to be signed by the VSB. Most teachers will be able to claim this amount for working days between March 30 to May 31 This is not a rebate or refund, but a tax deduction as part of the calculation of your tax return.
- You can receive your T4 electronically through the PeopleSoft employee self-service in mid-February

FSA

Just a reminder that the FSA has been delayed until February this year. BCTF and VESTA continue our advocacy with the new Minister and the VSB to encourage cancellation or suspension of this program, and the honouring of parent opt-out letters.

The BCTF campaign in opposition will begin soon. It is ridiculous that in this year the FSA is scheduled to go ahead, and we are seeking clear instruction about the administration of that test, taking the position that administration options will have an impact on school safety, teacher workload, and seriously undermine any results from the test. Reminder that you can find the FSA information sheet and opt-out form on the VESTA Website <u>here</u> and <u>here</u>. Information to parents must be addressed and delivered through students in a sealed envelope, and notice must be given to administrators 4 hours ahead of the intended distribution.

BCTF School Liaison Officer research project

The BCTF undertook a research project on policing in schools and determined that there was a significant lack of research that has been completed about the experiences of BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Colour) teachers in Canada with regards to the impact of policing in schools. The BCTF has now undertaken a provincial study to centre these voices in a new study.

The BCTF will be appointing two BIPOC members from each of four locals to be co-researchers supporting the new research study that will be available for wider participation by BIPOC teachers across the province. Failures to Fill
