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
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### **COVID Leave Reminders**



If you have a regular illness (cold, flu etc.) and stay home, this comes, as usual, from your sick bank and should be booked using SFE for personal illness.

Our Collective Agreement provides for the use of sick leave with pay for "unavoidable quarantine" in Article G.20.2.a, which is the leave members have been using when self-isolating as per Health Authority direction.

As of Feb 1, in situations where a member is directed by the Health Authority to self-isolate, they are eligible for a new paid leave that does not require the use of sick leave. This leave only applies in cases where the member is asymptomatic. In Coastal Health, written directions to self-isolate are being provided. If you are booking this leave, you will be required to agree that you will return to sick leave if you become symptomatic. **This leave is only for asymptomatic members who are required to self-isolate as a result of a Health Authority direction.** 

TTOCs have access to this new leave, but only on days for which they had been previously booked to work.

If a member on the new paid COVID leave becomes symptomatic, or tests positive for COVID-19, they will be required to begin using sick leave again.

The BCTF is continuing to advocate for this leave to be applied retroactively, but at this time, it is being provided on a go-forward basis only. Please watch for further updates.

# **BC Teachers Council Elections**

The BC Teachers' Council is part of the regulatory structures of teachers in British Columbia. They oversee teacher training, the professional standards, and the Professional Conduct Unit (PCU). On the Teachers' Council, there are spots for elected members, and it is essential that we participate in the election of teacher representatives that reflect our values and will effectively speak for teachers. The current rep for Coastal Region is our very own Marjorie Dumont, Resource teacher at Xpey' Elementary.



Marjorie is running for re-election and has been endorsed by VESTA and the BCTF. Starting this week, you will receive an invitation to vote for the Teachers' Council rep for our region and it's important that you exercise your vote to ensure that BCTF maintains our representation on the Council.
