#### **School Visits**

Due to illness and challenges coordinating, our Spring EC school visits are taking longer than expected. Please be patient with us while we determine the roll out of our VESTA listening sessions and bargaining updates. Our EC is working hard to ensure that all schools are reached as quickly as possible.

#### **Wellness Consultation**

In the last VESTA General Meeting, VESTA members had a lot to say about the VSB Wellness program in the context of the District Goals of wellness and safety of students and staff, equity, and Reconciliation. Thank you to each of you who participated in the discussion and brought forward feedback from your school staff.

We have reviewed and compiled your feedback into a letter that has been provided to the VSB Wellness Department and Senior Management. We will also be forwarding it to Trustees. You can read the letter on the VESTA website.

The themes that emerged from the consultation were: VSB Lack of Respect and Trust for Employees; Increasing Workload and lack of trauma informed practice; Individual and Problematic focus on Wellness; and Inadequacy of the current EFAP and VSB services.

### **Spring Transfer!**

Your Staff rep will likely be calling a VESTA meeting to discuss school organization once staffing entitlements have been provided to you by your Administrator. Staffing entitlements should be widely shared, as transparency and equitable access to information supports collaborative discussions about next year.

School organization can be a stressful time for members, especially in years of potential surplus. Please be mindful of the challenges some members are facing in this respect, as well as the fact that surplus years tend to result in greater internal reorganization than some might be expecting.

It's important to respect one another's privacy regarding the terms of leaves and potential retirements, and to acknowledge that as information emerges, there may need to be changes to organizations. This is due, in part, to the fact that the VSB budget has not been finalized.

When postings do come out, they are open to all members. You do not have to have put in a vacate card in order to apply for positions in the Spring Transfer process, and there is no obligation to accept a position you have applied for.

Staff Reps attended an intensive Post and Fill workshop this week and the powerpoint can be found on the VESTA website.

Some key messages to keep in mind:


- Seniority is a fair and unbiased way of organizing a school
- Staff Committee is the structure by which members advise the principal of our opinions and advice. This includes ensuring that the school posting process is timely, transparent, and follows the Collective Agreement.
- We do not participate in teacher interviews for ethical reasons, but we still
  participate in all aspects of the post and fill process! The Interview Committee is
  a subcommittee of the Staff Committee and should advise the Principal on
  posting language, shortlisting, timelines and offers.
- Seniority lists are available in schools through your administrator. Please ask
  them for the most recent list and email jody@vesta.ca or marjorie@vesta.ca if
  you experience challenges receiving or sharing this information
- Staffing Entitlements and School Organization Allotments are also available through your Administrator and should be widely shared with staff.

Pacific Gateway hotel workers went on strike in May 2021 after the hotel terminated 143 long-term workers, mostly women, during the pandemic. The firings came after the federal government took over the hotel as a quarantine site and brought in contractors. The feds left the hotel earlier this year, but Pacific Gateway workers continue to fight back against mass firings and economic rollbacks.
