Friends of The Congo

At the October 7th meeting of the Social Justice & Solidarity meeting, committee members passed a motion to promote awareness of the Friends of The Congo initiative. The Friends of the Congo (FOTC) is an organization that was was established in 2004 to work in partnership with Congolese to bring about peaceful and lasting change in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), formerly Zaire. The DRC has long been a site of violent exploitation by Western powers and multinational corporations that profit from critical minerals like cobalt and coltan, essential to technology that we use such as smartphones and laptops. Understanding Leaves

One of the most frequent topics of support that comes up at the VEAES office is that of leaves. Leaves can be a stressful undertaking to engage with, and the sometimes-opaque nature of the process can add to the stressful nature of the interaction.

This is a friendly reminder that VEAES has produced a helpful reference document available to assist members in navigating leaves under the Employment Standards Act and our Collective Agreement. Released last May, this resource clarifies your rights and responsibilities regarding paid and unpaid leaves and outlines the application processes for each type of leave. You can find the document on our website here, where it details the available leaves, eligibility criteria, duration, application procedures, and their impact on salary.

We encourage you to review this guide to help determine the best leave for your needs and understand the processes for accessing leaves through the VSB. If you have applied for one of these leaves and have been denied, and/or are experiencing emergency or extenuating circumstances, please contact the VEAES office for advice regarding other options. As always, we are very happy to discuss your questions about leaves via calls to the office, but we encourage you to add this document to your worker toolkit as an extra support.

Expressions of interest (EOI) are now open for the Anti-Racism and Anti-Oppression Office's (ARAOO) Conference "Equity in Motion: Practicing Liberation in our Movements." This event is for Aboriginal, Indigenous, Black, and racialized members, and will be held on January 22–24, 2026, at the Coast Coal Harbour Vancouver Hotel on Musqueam, Squamish, and Tsleil-Waututh territory. Building on a legacy of activism and advocacy by generations of educators, the event will bring together 80 Indigenous, Black, and racialized BCTF members from across the province to explore what racialized leadership can look like in roles of service or leadership, to resource ourselves and our bodies, and to practice ways of being that can help us live into liberation as a daily practice.

2026 BCTF Women's Institute

The BCTF are excited to announce that the **2026 BCTF Women's Institute** will take place on **February 19–21, 2026**, at the Coast Coal Harbour Hotel in Vancouver. This event is open to members with equity-deserving gender identities, including cis and trans women, and non-binary and gender non-conforming people who are comfortable in a space that centres the experiences of women.

In addition, delegates must meet the following criteria:

- has not attended a Women's Institute in the past five years
- is available and committed to attending in February 2026.

The Objectives for the Women's Institute are as follows:

- 1. to create an opportunity for members to share their experiences, build community, and learn new leadership skills and strategies together
- 2. to support and inspire women's leadership in the workplace, union, and broader community
- 3. to deepen an understanding of women's issues, decolonization, feminist analyses, intersectionality, and effective collective organizing
- 4. to celebrate the contributions of women in the union, profession, and community.

Preference will be given to members of equity-seeking groups, and teachers in their first five years of teaching. Please keep your eyes open for application information coming in the near future, as VEAES will be able to send one delegate to this 2026 event. Members will also be able to apply directly to the BCTF in a later round.



Ways for Teachers to Access PSA Memberships

There are many ways for teachers to access a PSA membership:

- 1. Purchase a PSA membership directly from the BCTF.
- 2. Participate in a PSA conference.
- 3. Participate in an induction ceremony or welcome event at their Local.
- 4. Participate in a BCTF workshop or SURT for TTOCs or new teachers.
- 5. Upload a resource to TeachBC.

Purchase a PSA membership directly from the BCTF.

The easiest way to handle this is to have the member purchase their PSA membership directly from the *BCTF Shopify store*, and then reimburse the member for the purchase if your Pro-D language supports this.

Some locals prefer to avoid having the member pay up front and have previously submitted paper forms along with a cheque for payment of the fees. The Federation is phasing out paper forms, but the Shopify page does not allow for a Local to make direct purchases on someone else's behalf. If a local wishes to purchase PSA memberships directly for their members, please contact psa-coordinator@bctf.ca for the appropriate forms and instructions.

Participate in a PSA conference.

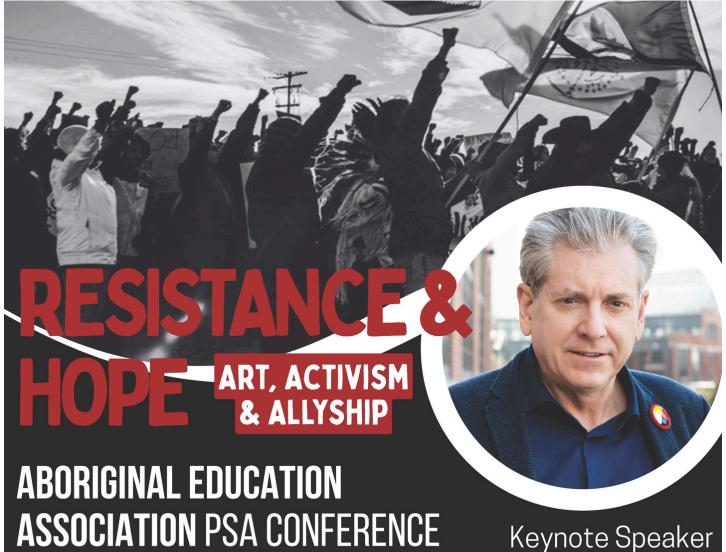
Many PSAs either provide a PSA membership as part of conference attendance or provide the option of purchasing one during the registration process. Most PSAs hold their conference on the October PSA day, but they may hold additional conferences later in the year or hold their main conference at an alternate time. Links to PSA websites and conference registration sites can be found at www.PSAday.ca.

Participate in a Local induction ceremony or welcome event.

The BCTF provides a free PSA membership to each new inductee who attends a Local induction ceremony or welcome event. Previously, these were done via paper form. The process has been streamlined, however. Now, Locals collect the first name, last name, and email address of the inductee, and the Local president has access to an *upload process* that will then automatically email each member on the list with a code. The member uses the code at the BCTF Shopify store to sign up for a free PSA membership. Inquiries regarding the process can be made to *psa-coordinator@bctf.ca*.

Participate in a BCTF workshop or SURT for TTOCs or new teachers.

Local organizers for BCTF Workshops or SURTs that are asked to provide an excel sheet containing the first and last names of attending members and an email address. Members will be emailed a code for the BCTF Shopify store that can be used to sign up for a free PSA membership.


