Education Leaves Reminder

If you are planning to take an education leave for one full school year, your application must be submitted by December 15 of the preceding year. For education leaves less than one school year but more than 10 days, applications must be received at least three months prior to the start of the leave. If the leave requested totals 10 days or fewer, the application must be submitted at least four weeks before the leave begins. Deadlines for Porting Seniority, Teaching Experience, and Sick Leave

Reminder to members who have recently signed a continuing contract, that you should have received forms to fill out to ensure your seniority, teaching experience, and sick leave is ported. You have 120 days from accepting a continuing contract to port those days. There are forms that you need to submit to your previous district. In terms of seniority, you can port up to 20 years. In terms of sick leave, you can port up to 60 days. In terms of teaching experience, the VSB's practice does not count your TTOC experience when porting from another district, which can impact your placement on the salary grid in comparison to your previous district. Please email EmployeeServices@vsb.bc.ca to check that your forms have been processed well in advance of your 120-day limit.

Our BCTF Bargaining Team Needs Us!

Last week I attended the BCTF Federation Leadership Institute. Along with teachers and union leaders from across the province, I met with bargaining team members and got an update on how things are going at the negotiating table. The long and short of it? Teachers in every district of BC are facing unprecedented challenges in their classrooms. The BCTF has been trying to negotiate improvements to our working conditions, but BCPSEA (BC Public School Employers' Association) is still asking us to do more with less. Now the bargaining team members are asking for everyone's help. We need to make sure the government knows that teachers are watching the negotiations closely, and if they don't meaningfully commit resources to address teachers' dire workload issues now, then we won't be able to agree on a contract.

The BCTF is asking locals to organize weekly "Red for BC Ed" campaigns, where the entire school staff wears red on the same day to show their solidarity and support. VEAES is recommending that elementary teachers in Vancouver wear red every Tuesday. Take pictures and share them on social media using the hashtag #RedforBCEd; send your pictures to the VEAES office, and we will share them with the BCTF bargaining team and in the VEAES Weekly. The bargaining team members told us they have been putting the photos up on the walls in their office, and they really help to lift their spirits and motivate them, so let's keep it up! They are a passionate, dedicated, and organized group of teachers, but when it comes down to it, they are only seven people. If we really want the NDP government to honour the campaign promises they made to public education, we have to remind them that there are over 50,000 public school teachers who vote. By wearing red on Tuesdays, we can show the government and the community that teachers care passionately about their students and will do everything they can in support of public education. So, what will you be wearing next Tuesday? #RedforBCEd!


